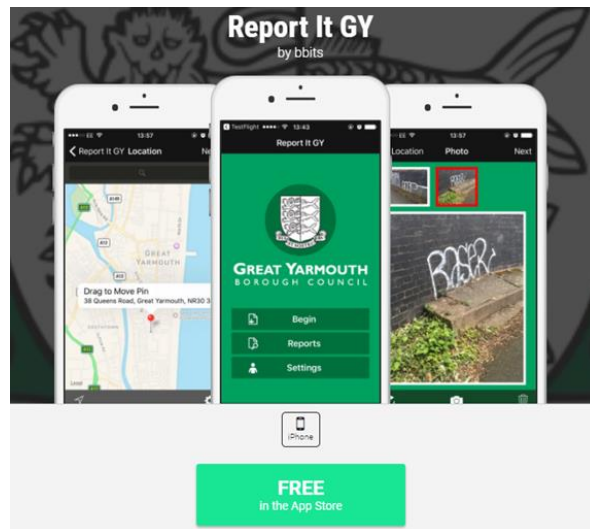

### Roads, pavements and cycleways defect types

 <p><b>Potholes</b> Large holes on the road, path or cycleway surface</p>	 <p><b>Drainage and flooding</b> Standing water, ditches, blocked drain, flooded property, impassable road</p>	 <p><b>Highway damage (excluding potholes)</b> Cracks or other damage excluding potholes to a road</p>	 <p><b>Hedges and trees</b> Trees or hedges that have fallen into the road or are leaning, unstable, diseased or dying</p>
 <p><b>Streetlights</b> Broken, missing or problems with streetlights</p>	 <p><b>Manhole cover</b> Broken, missing or rocking manhole cover</p>	 <p><b>Grass, weed or verges</b> Overgrowth creating issues or obstructions</p>	 <p><b>Road signs and posts</b> Damaged, missing or dirty road and warning signs</p>
 <p><b>Obstructions, spillages and mud</b> Thick mud, soil, stones, embankment slips, large branches and illegal road signs</p>	 <p><b>Road markings</b> White and yellow, stop or give way lines</p>	 <p><b>Surface dressing</b> Bleeding tarmac or missing chippings of a road</p>	 <p><b>Traffic lights</b> Damage or fault to traffic lights or signals</p>
 <p><b>Street furniture</b> Damaged, missing or unsuitable condition of roadside fences or barriers</p>	 <p><b>Cats eyes and studs</b> Damaged, obstructed or missing cats eyes or studs</p>	 <p><b>Bridges</b> Structural damage or significant obstructions restricting water flow</p>	 <p><b>Winter maintenance</b> Ice or snow on road and empty or damaged grit bins</p>

## Public right of way or trail defect types

 <p><b>Overgrown surface</b> Surface vegetation affecting use of public rights of way or trails</p>	 <p><b>Overgrown trees or bushes</b> Trees or bushes affecting the use of public rights of way or trails</p>	 <p><b>Damaged or missing sign</b> Damaged or missing finger posts or way-marker signs</p>	 <p><b>Obstruction (man-made)</b> Obstructions preventing use of public rights of way or trails, including unauthorised gates or barriers</p>
 <p><b>Surface condition</b> Unsuitable surface condition affecting use of public rights of way or trails</p>	 <p><b>Crops or ploughing</b> Crops or ploughing affecting public rights of way or trails</p>	 <p><b>Gate or barrier</b> Damaged, missing or problematic gates or barriers</p>	 <p><b>Tree dangerous or fallen</b> Large vegetation that is affecting the use of, or may cause harm to users of, public rights of way or trails</p>
 <p><b>Misleading sign</b> Finger posts, way-marker or other signs displaying incorrect, illegal or unsuitable information</p>	 <p><b>Bridge</b> Damaged or missing bridge</p>	 <p><b>Illegal or vehicle use</b> Inappropriate or illegal use of a public right of way or trail</p>	 <p><b>Flooded path</b> Standing water affecting public rights of way or trails</p>
 <p><b>Stile damaged, too high or other</b> Unusable stiles due to damage or misplacement</p>	 <p><b>Animals</b> Animals affecting use of public rights of way or trail</p>	 <p><b>Steps damaged or other</b> Damaged or missing steps</p>
